The app I choose to redesign is TeacherKit. TeacherKit describes itself as "helps you organize classes and students easily".

The description explains that a user could "create a seating chart, record attendance, log behavior, and track grades", along with "staying informed on your student's performance and the class overall progress and keep the parents informed".

The first step in this redesign process was to look at TeacherKit's reviews and ratings. This helped with what I needed to focus on in the redesign. Overall, TeacherKit had a 4.4 out of 5 stars. When testing out the application I thought the overall layout was not conventional. While going through the reviews I found that users liked the idea of the app, however, the function of the application was the issue.

"I use this app to keep up with my intervention kids during RTI. I do wish I could add individual notes about students, but overall I love the TeacherKit app."

"There is nobody to have a live chat to enquire about for example how many classes I can create without having the premium subscription."

"Went through the process for a monthly "Premium" subscription, and nothing works. App states I am subscribed, but no features work. App "support" link is a dead end. No "Contact" link works either, so there is no way to find out what the problem is. So far, this is a big mistake."

"I love the app but was wondering if you guys could add to where you can mark assignments missing, late and excused."

"I think this app is a 5 star because they keep track of your students. This helps with my students remotely. Personally I think it will work with students the only flaw is that you need to pay to get a better teaching experience."

Reviews

Along with redesigning TeacherKit, I wanted to add a E-Z Grader function to the app. The app I choose to redesign and incorporate into TeacherKit is Groovy Grader. Groovy Grader describes itself as "an app designed to replace your "old school" paper grading calculator and provides more flexibility, convenience and ease than other popular slide graders.".

The description explains that a user could "work for 100's of questions and has the option to display the grade as a whole number or with one decimal place". Groovy Grader can "show the number correct, the number wrong or both".

The first step in this redesign process was to look at Groovy Grader's reviews and ratings. This helped with what I needed to focus on in the redesign. Overall, this application had a 4.9 out of 5 stars. While going through the reviews I found that users liked the idea of the app, however, wanted to have letter grades included in the scale. A user also left a comment suggesting the addition of an apple watch verison.

A really great feature this application has that I wanted to include in my redesign was a easy grader. Another feature this application is more successful is attendance. It is easier to read and is overall designed better. In the Teacher Aide Pro application, the UI is better designed then TeacherKit. A nice feature is application has is the color code system and I wanted to bring that into TeacherKit.

I then found one main competitor for Groovy Grader which is QuickGrader. This application feels very clean and organized which is something Groovy Grader needs.



INTERVIEWEE #2

1) What works (functionality) within the app?

The buttons are fairly responsive and I like how you can customize many different things within the app to work for your class. I also like how you can set criteria for grades and behaviors.

2) What does not work (functionality) within the app?

It can take a longer time for some parts of the app to be responsive. For example, the loading screen when logging on can get interrupted with pop ups. I don't like that free version users can only sync from one device. If I needed to do something quickly on my phone and then wanted to move to my iPad, I can't do that. I would love to be able to copy and paste lessons, since a lot of our lesson structures repeat.

3) What are your feelings with the app? (Was it easy to work with? Was the navigation hard to figure out? etc...)

It was fairly easy to work with. Trying to figure out what you can do/can't do in certain sections of the app and without buying the premium version took a little time. I liked how you can easily add students from class to class without retyping names and info. I also liked how you can give points for behavior since students are motivated by points and it helps show a pattern of behavior. I like the things you can see when you are using an iPad or bigger device. The app looks more professional that way.

4) Does it fit all your needs when grading? Is there something else that would be more useful? With my elementary school we don't really keep grades in the traditional sense. I keep data on students in spreadsheets and just use observations to determine report card grading at the end of the trimester. With that, a gradebook is not as useful to me. The things we do often are a score out of around 15. If we do a dictation, I will give them only about 7 words. I like that you can choose the max grade.

5) Were there any problems? Any glitches?

Sometimes pop ups can interrupt what I'm doing or make me press something incorrectly.

6) Is there anything you would add from the app?

Ease of use across devices.

7) Is there anything you would delete from the app?

I don't know if I would say get rid of the attendance section, but we have to submit attendance online to the school, so I don't find a use for that part. It feels redundant to me and like more work.

8) Please write down any and all observations.

It takes a lot of investigating to figure out all of the parts and what you can and can't access with a free account and across different devices.

9) Any insights about grading?

It would be useful if there was a way to copy and paste gradable assignments so you didn't have to retype them. Also an easier way to see any details on graded assignments like notes. For example, if a students scores poorly on a test and I want to make a note that their attention played a role in that, I would like to be able to do that. I'd also like to be able to click on grades without the possibility of accidentally changing them.

10) Any and all ideas for the app?




Empathy Maps

This way, we can understand and prioritize their most important needs. With this information, we can also remove any bias from our designs and focus it around what the user wants to see, not us.


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Persona




Information Architecture


For the first step in redesigning TeacherKit, I created an information architecture. This allows us to understand how I will lay out the appliation, and what I will be including in each navigation tab.




















Inspiration


Brand Guideline
